WORKSHEETS

Each worksheet offers step-by-step instructions for drawing a cartoon figure. You will need a copy of the worksheet for each class member, in addition to blank paper, pencils and erasers for them to do the exercise. You can also provide pens and markers to further enhance the completed cartoons if time allows. You can choose one cartoon worksheet to do together in class, then provide the rest as handouts.
